OTTAWA, **March 6**, **2012** – Today, the Ottawa Dragon Boat Foundation introduced Kanata South Councillor Allan Hubley as honorary chair for the 2012 fundraising season. With his first official act in the new role, Councillor Hubley expressed support of the Foundation and their new tier one charity, Youth Services Bureau of Ottawa.
